2. Format of Report Writing:

- 1. **Title**: The heading of the report (should be brief and relevant).
- 2. **Introduction**: Provides the purpose and context of the report.
- 3. **Main Body**: Describes the events in detail, structured in paragraphs.

- 4. **Conclusion**: Summarizes the main findings or outcomes.
- 5. **Signature/Name and Designation**: The report writer's signature/name at the end (if applicable).

MATHEMATICS

1. Personal Budget Project

Apply rational numbers and profit/loss concepts to personal budgeting.

Process: i. Students create a mock monthly budget for themselves or a fictional character, including income, expenses, and savings.

- ii. They categorize expenses (groceries, transportation, entertainment) and calculate total profit (savings) or loss (debt).
- iii. The project requires adding and subtracting rational numbers to adjust the budget.
- iv. Students present their budget, highlighting key areas of profit or loss.

2. Rational Number Recipes

Explore rational numbers through cooking and measuring ingredients.

Process:

- i. Students choose a recipe that requires fractions or decimals in its measurements.
- ii. They adjust the recipe to serve different numbers of people, recalculating the ingredients using rational numbers.
- iii. The project includes creating a new shopping list based on the adjusted recipe and determining the total cost, applying profit and loss to the grocery bill.
 - iv. Students submit their recipe adjustments, cost calculations, and explanations.

Note – Students are informed to prepare their mathematics project in A4 size paper or color paper.

SCIENCE

COMPUTER

Create an animation in Krita to show the stages of plant's growth by the following steps:

- 1. Open Krita software and create a new canvas of desired size and resolution for your animation.
- 2. Select the Brush tool from the toolbox to draw a small seedling at the starting position on the canvas. This will be the initial stage of the plant.
- 3. Click on the Choose workspace button and select the Animation option from the list. This will display the animation timeline at the bottom of the screen.
- 4. Duplicate the seedling layer for each frame. Then, gradually add more leaves, branches, and roots in each frame to depict the plant's growth. You can modify the layers by using the Brush tool or other drawing tools in Krita.
- 5. Use the Timeline to add more frames to your animation. Each frame represents a stage in the plant's growth. You can adjust the duration of each frame as needed.
- 7. Save the file with a suitable name.
